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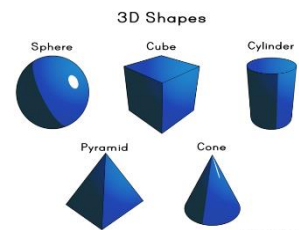


Spotlight on Learning

YR

In Maths the children have been learning about 3D shapes.

They have also learnt about animals and their young. The children completed a Big Write and made their own information books!



Y1

In Year 1 this week the children have been learning how to measure using rulers.

In English they have been really enjoying our Talk for Writing unit on ‘The Pirates are Coming’ and have been really excited to change the characters in the story to make it their own.

In their Science lesson this week, the children have been looking for signs of Spring in our school grounds. Our PSHE focus has been on keeping clean, and why this is important.



Y2

This week the children have written their stories based on the True Story of The Three Little Pigs. They created stories based on other traditional tales such as Goldilocks and the Three Bears, The Gingerbread Man and The Three Billy Goats Gruff. They have had really creative ideas about why the usually villainous characters are actually innocent.

In Science, they have been looking at what animals need to survive. They know, like humans, they have three basic needs but some animals, such as dogs need other things to also be happy and healthy. They wrote fact files about pets and explained how to look after them.

In PSHE, the children are learning about safety around medicines. They know who is responsible for giving them medicines, what some medicines might look like and what to do if they see medicine not stored away safely.

In Art they are making animal sculptures from clay after being inspired by artist Peter Leadbeater.
