




Spotlight on Learning

In Maths the children have continued to strengthen their understanding of numbers to 20.













Amazing new "Super Veggie" characters by the children in Reception.

This week the children have been learning about verbs and have been practising using them in their sentences. In Maths they have been looking at the beginnings of multiplication, and looking for equal and unequal groups.

In Art they have been looking at how to draw feathers and how to create effects using just a pencil!





Fantastic effects in feathery Art!


In English, Year 2 have started developing their own characters in preparation for writing a persuasive letter in the style of The Day the Crayons quit. They have chosen items that they either use very often and are overworked and tired or items that they do not use anymore so they're feeling abandoned and unloved. They have been doing short bursts of writing, practising commands, writing in the first person and presenting an opinion and reason for them wanting to quit.

In Maths, they have been reading scales in millilitres and litres when measuring volume and capacity and then going on to solve problems involving the four operations. The children were encouraged to draw the problem out to help them solve it.

In Science, they have been answering the question *What is a bulb?* They have looked at plant bulbs and inside an onion bulb to see the different parts. They drew diagrams of the bulb and labelled it then they explained what the function of each part was. They will have the opportunity to see what they remember about this activity in their homework this week!



In Geography, they read the story of Sally and the Limpet about a girl who visits Wembury beach and what she sees there. They looked at photographs of the activities that you can do at the seaside. They then wrote a postcard to a friend imagining that they had visited Wembury beach and told them the activities they did.



In Computing, they worked together in pairs to create rhythms using percussion instruments. They were then introduced to the website Chrome Music Lab to show them how easy it is to make rhythms using technology. Click here to have a try at home
